4. Fire and movement is not permitted on Melville	
<ul><li>Bay A</li><li>Shooters are only to engage targets in their lane and are not to cross lane shoot</li></ul>	
6. Targets are not to be engaged after passing the trip lever	
<ul> <li>Bays B - E</li> <li>7. A Suitably Qualified Experience Person (SQEP) is to be appointed as the responsible RO when shooting</li> </ul>	
<ol> <li>Shooters are to move forward to the 25m firing point to shoot at that distance, targets are not to be located on the 25m firing point</li> </ol>	
<ol> <li>When firing from 50m, the 25m firing point is to be clear of all ricochet inducing material</li> </ol>	
<ul> <li>10. Positions Permitted:</li> <li>a. Bay A: Standing or Benched</li> <li>b. Bays B-E: Sitting, kneeling, standing, benched</li> </ul>	
<ol> <li>Permission to fire from any other position, must be notified in the booking request and granted by the Range Office in order to allow suitable target allocation on the range</li> </ol>	
12. Changes of position are permitted within any detail or practice outside competition providing all firers follow the same sequence, and in competition in accordance with the conditions	
13. MAX TCH: 1.5m	
14. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and /or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified, in writing, and approved by the Range Services Manager	
15. Falling plates or other hard targets may not be engaged within Melville Range	
16. Users are not permitted to provide their own hard targets	
17. Clay pigeons are not to be engaged within Melville Range
